SOCIALIZATION

- Socialization is the cultural process of learning to participate in group life.
- Socialization begins at birth and continues throughout life
- The most important learning occurs early in life
- Without socialization a human infant cannot develop the set of attitudes, beliefs, values, and behavior associated with being human
- Developmental growth can be improved with only 20 minutes of extra touching a day

Key Agents of the Socialization Process

- Family
- Peers
- Media
- School

Description of Agents

- They play different roles
- They have different impacts on development
- They may reinforce or contradict one another
- They can be intentional or unintentional
- They occur in many different setting
