Founders of Sociology

- Paradigm Shifts-(Industrial Rev & French Rev)-Enlightenment
- From stability rooted community & common values & beliefs
- To drastic changes in economic, political & social forces
 - > Founders' POV--set of circumstances--activists, reformers
 - "Why are certain elements of society the way they?"
 - > They make unique contributions--cluster around common key concepts:
 - Five Key Concepts: culture, functional integration, power, social structure, social action
 - Three Theoretical Perspective: set of assumptions
 - « Functionalism-change, settles back into stability
 - « Conflict Theory-constant challenge, competition, constraints on some groups
 - « Symbolic Interactionist-common symbols, language hold society together
